



## Carol Ann Phillips

November 2, 1934 - August 14, 2017

Carol Ann Phillips, 82, passed away on August 14, 2017. Born in Flushing, Queens, New York City to Alex and Anna Dorvel, November 2, 1934, Carol grew up as the youngest sibling to Arnold (deceased) and Elsie Richardson.

At the age of 18, she met the love of her life, Harvey Phillips, an aspiring, young, and talented tuba player. They were wed February 22, 1954 and for 10 years were very much involved in the professional music scene in New York City. Shortly after the birth of their first son Jesse in (1964), Carol dedicated herself to providing a comfortable and peaceful household for the growing family, always supporting her husband in his budding performance career but always putting her children first. After the birth of two more sons, Harvey II (1966) and Thomas (1968), Carol and Harvey were given the opportunity to move the family from Massachusetts to Bloomington, Indiana where Harvey accepted the position of Professor of Tuba at Indiana University.

Tubaranch, now a well recognized location by many musicians around the world , was carved out of the southern Indiana countryside mostly due to Carol's hard work, dedication to family and belief in Harvey's vision for the tuba. Octubafest, TubaChristmas, TubaSanta's, TubaEaster, Tuba Company and many solo and ensemble compositions were a result of collaboration and sacrifice by Carol and Harvey. After Harvey's death in Octuba, 2010, Carol was instrumental in the continuation of Harvey's legacy - The Harvey Phillips Foundation, ...“dedicated to the development, expansion, and the preservation of the musical arts”... Until her death, Carol directed the foundation and lived and worked on Tubaranch.

Carol is survived by her three sons and their families; Dr. Jesse and wife Kim of Fort Pierce, FL , Dr. Harvey II and wife Alison of Jacksonville, FL and Thomas, of Bloomington, IN, grandsons Jesse IV, Connor, Reagan, and Riley.

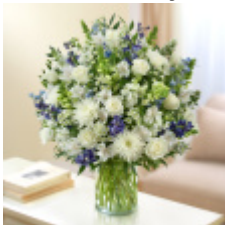

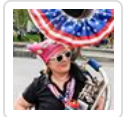
